If you're part of a student group:

Lewis & Clark students are mostly going to the Lewis & Clark site, walking as a group from Fowler (bon entrance) at 8:45.

What to bring:

Please remember to bring a water bottle and snacks, and dress in good shoes and layers for the weather (and mud!).

You may wish to bring a **change of shoes**/clothes for the pizza party after.

Tools, instruction, and snacks are provided at each site.

(Note: Due to rain in the forecast, it may be a good call to pack an extra pair of gloves in order to switch out midway through!)

Boonesferry Terrace Greenspace

- Students, please print and bring the waiver signed by your parent or guardian.
- We will meet at **9845 SW 6th Ave** at 9am for information about and direction to the site (essentially just behind the homes there).
- Directions: From Terwilliger Blvd, turn onto SW 6th Ave (if heading North on Terwilliger, this is a left turn after Riverdale HS; if heading South on Terwilliger, this is a right turn before Riverdale HS) then just stay straight on SW 6th heading downhill. This work area is a greenspace behind the houses at the end of SW 6th Ave.
- We will be removing various invasive plants so that the native plants can thrive and not be outcompeted, and planting some native plants.
- Tools, gloves, and instructions will be provided (and snacks!). That said, with a variety of species to consider targeting, feel welcome to bring your own gloves *-especially leather gloves* and tools of choice handheld loppers, pruners, trowels, and/or shovels.

Jackson Middle School

with the Westside Watershed Resource Center 10625 SW 35th Ave.. Portland OR 97219

Join us as we remove **English ivy and Himalayan blackberry** near the community trail on the south side of campus. This ongoing stewardship effort, which began in 2018, helps restore native habitat in the **Falling Creek subwatershed**, a major tributary of **Tryon Creek**.

We'll provide **tools**, **gloves**, **and snacks**—all you need to bring is your enthusiasm! We hope to see you there for another great year of making a positive impact on our watershed.

Where to meet at 9am:

Park in the southernmost lot on campus, downhill just past the school buildings. Meet at the dead-end of this lot, past the greenhouses. If you're walking from the neighborhood, this path can be accessed by foot from SW 40th and SW 39th Ave.

<u>Lake Oswego United Church of Christ (LOUCC)</u>

At this site you will be mostly focused on invasive species removal, including English ivy or Armenian blackberry work. This area along Spirit Creek is in the Nettle Creek subwatershed, and the LOUCC and TCWC have been stewarding this property together for several years.

Gloves, tools, and instructions will be provided (as will snacks), but if you have your own gloves, and/or tools, feel free to bring them! (Double-layered regular & leather gloves are great for blackberry removal!)

<u>Lewis & Clark College</u> (Law Campus/Huston Field)

Ariana Scipioni with West Multnomah Soil & Water Conservation District, and our Student Representative Board Members Sylvia Barclay and Gwyn Murphy-Cunningham, will be leading this site.

Your site details: Lewis & Clark College near Law School/Huston Sports Field

- Meet in the parking lot at the Huston Sports complex (10120 SW Boones Ferry Rd).
 OR
- Meet in the parking lot at the Lewis & Clark Law School campus (**10101 S Terwilliger Blvd**, head to the right (west), here).
- **LC Students**, this is about a 15-min walk from the undergraduate campus. A group will meet in front of Fowler (near the bon entrance) to walk together at 8:45.
- The work area is along the path behind the Law School campus. We will be doing some native plant planting, and removing various invasive plants so that the native plants can thrive and not be outcompeted, and planting some native plants too.
- Tools, gloves, and instructions will be provided (so will coffee and snacks!).

Tryon Life Community Farm

Hike in from Tryon Creek State Natural Area's Nature Center, 11321 S Terwilliger Blvd, 97219

- Please note that due to another event at the TLC Farm that day their parking lot will be full, so our group will be meeting **in front of the Nature Center** at Tryon Creek State Natural Area. From there, Brenna with TLC Farm will lead the ~20-minute group walk to the TLC Farm.
- There are two Watershed Wide Event groups gathering at TCSNA (the Friends of Tryon Creek group will gather at the Friends Circle). Please provide yourself time for parking.
- We will be removing invasive blackberries along an ephemeral tributary to Tryon Creek, known as Willow Creek, so that the native plants can thrive and not be outcompeted.
- Tools, gloves, and instructions (and snacks!) will be provided. We encourage you to bring your own gloves (regular and/or leather) and loppers! Extra gloves may be great to switch out midway through if it's super rainy.

[FULL] Marshall Park

At Marshall Park, you will be planting native plants along the main stem of Tryon Creek! Tools, gloves, and instruction will be provided, as will coffee and snacks, and there's a porta potty on site. **If you have shovels and extra gloves, please do bring them!**

Where to meet at 9am: We'll be meeting near the Marshall Park playground at 9am, and working not too far from there (if you haven't driven to Marshall Park before, please read the directions; the park has multiple entrances and map apps may lead you astray).

Driving & Parking directions

<u>Address:</u> Park near **9200 SW 12th Dr**, Portland OR 97219 (this will be at a dead-end/turnaround), and head down the stairs to the left of the portapotty to meet near the playground.

<u>Note:</u> Some phone/maps may not take you all the way down SW 12th, so if it's your first time to Marshall Park be sure to **look online ahead of time!** Also, some folks lose cell service in the park.

<u>Directions:</u> From SW Taylors Ferry Rd, turn east/downhill onto SW Taylors Ferry Ct, then S (right) onto SW 12th Dr., and follow the neighborhood road down to the dead-end/turnaround at the end of SW 12th.

[FULL] Tryon Creek State Natural Area

with Friends of Tryon Creek 11321 S Terwilliger Blvd, Portland OR 97219

- We will be gathering by the **Friends Circle**. When facing the Nature Center, the Friends Circle is to your left.
- Note that there are two Watershed Wide Event groups gathering at TCSNA (the Tryon Life Community Farm group will gather out front of the Nature Center).
- I recommend (a) typing the address in for navigation, since sometimes phones try to direct people to the middle of the 670-acre park!, and (b) giving yourself time for parking
- At this site we will be planting native plants! Along the main stem of Tryon Creek, in an area the Friends of Tryon Creek have been tending over the past few years. It's about a 15-min hike downhill to the project area.
